

It is a girls' boarding school located 190km Northwest of Nairobi, Kenya and 39km West of Nakuru City.

The school was founded by Sr Rose Wangui of the Catholic Diocese of Nakuru and opened its doors to its pioneer class in 2011.

Since its inception, the school has consistently upheld its reputation as a center of academic excellence by offering a conducive environment for holistic development of its students.

Majority of the students are drawn from underprivileged families who find it hard to afford education and have been enrolled on partial scholarships under Mercy Center Foundation.

It's academic program is anchored on Kenya's education system, the Competence-Based Curriculum (CBC) which equips learners with theoretical and practical skills critical for subsequent tertiary education.

The school also supports talents and skills development among students by encouraging their participation in co-curricular activities including games and sports.

Here, the school community cultivates a culture of love and togetherness in line with our core values of integrity, hard work, professionalism, team work, service and excellence.

The school's vision is to be a place where girls are thriving emotionally, intellectually, spiritually and physically to reach their potential.


We remain forever grateful to all partners and donors who have made this journey possible against many odds.

Keeping The Girl Child In Class

Mother of Mercy Girls Secondary School is not just a learning institution but a beacon of hope for many young girls who would have otherwise be relegated to the sidelines of the society.

The school currently has an enrollment 314 students drawn from across the country, selected after a rigorous vetting process that ensures the partial scholarships go to the most needy cases in our society.

For the first time, this year we have admitted girls from Northern Kenya counties where early marriages and other retrogressive practices such as Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) are still common and early marriages. To such students, the school is not just a place of learning but a place for their safety.

We have had instances of students preferring to remain at school during holidays as their parents may not afford transport or they feel the risk out there is too high which may mean them not reporting back.

Over the years, the school has continued to witness steady improvement in academic performance. In 2023, 60 of our students were candidates for the national exams. Their performance in the test placed the school on the fourth position in Njoro Sub County.

Students with better marks from primary school have enrolled at the school at this promises for even better results in the future.

The school has managed to establish key infrastructure such as laboratories but there is still need for more facilities and expansion of the existing ones.

As a school, we feel greatly indebted to our partners and sponsors who have ensured the school keeps running.

We particularly wish to thank Mr Daniello and his family whose immense and consistent contribution has made the school what it is today, milestones which would have otherwise not be achieved.

It is worth noting that many students even after offering them the partial scholarship, they cant afford making it challenging to run the school.

Some of the cases can be described as extremely needy as some students report to school without basic items such as uniforms and toiletries due to high poverty rates back at home.

As one of the ways of bridging the financial shortfall, the school has initiated income generating units whose proceeds we plough back to run the school.

The projects include an upcoming oil refinery, dairy, horticulture and poultry.

The Infrastructure

The Beneficiaries



Revenue Streams

The school has established various income generating units. Some of the produce is consumed within the school cutting the cost of purchasing the items. The surplus production is then sold to the local market and the proceeds ploughed back in subsidizing tuition for the needy students.
